Are we stealing the future away from our students by not using technology to its fullest potential? Are teachers personally motivated to use technology to stay connected and organized? Do teachers possess the knowledge and skills to successfully integrate technology daily? In this five week module, you will discover how to efficiently create and effectively integrate technology in the classroom and beyond through the use of Microsoft OneNote. Weekly, you will watch videos related to building relational capacity and discuss the ways each topic contributes to creating significant learning environments. You will then build three digital notebooks, one for personal use, the second for staff/faculty collaboration and the third for student/teacher use. Finally, you will share with your peers three significant contributions you made to each of your notebooks.

Desired Results: With OneNote, teachers will stay organized there by increasing their productivity, deliver a technology rich curriculum designed to develop students 21st century skills and foster collaborative learning environments with students and colleagues.
